



# ARTS AND CULTURE— Kathy Khalifa

Summer will soon be here, with loads of events planned in and around Orange County. One cultural activity that caught my eye is Alexei Ratmansky's Giselle Ballet, to be performed at Segerstrom Hall from June 29 to July 2nd. The ballet company is from the Ukraine, so it's sure to be brilliant. It's the West Coast premiere of this classic, so should be exciting! We plan on attending, so if you're interested, let me know and possibly arrange an evening together.





Our fundraiser planning meeting was held at my home on May 6th, and nine of us enjoyed a Limoncello Panettone with fruit, cheese and beverages. I shared my ideas of how we can promote the culinary artistic talent of Spanish chef Jose Andres, who founded World Central Kitchen in 2010. He and his team of cooks aid hungry people in disaster zones, beginning with Haiti in 2010, continuing today in the Ukraine, and future-focused to feed hungry people as climate change worsens.

The committee proposes a simple luncheon meal of Koshiary, which is the national dish of Egypt, popular not only for its nutrition but its easy preparation. When my children attended Cairo American College in Cairo, Egypt in the early 90's, this was the school lunch. The dish consists of rice, elbow macaroni, lentils, a special tomato sauce and spices, topped with fried onions and garbanzo beans. The committee will prepare the food, and will use bamboo plates and ecological utensils to serve. We may look for garden roses, other simple decor and sweets from members. The planned venue is The Club at Rancho Niguel. Our plan at this time is to serve at 12:30. Those who have chafing dishes might loan them for the event, as we hope to have a good crowd. Friends and significant others are also welcome.

The date, suggested by our President, Rosemarie, is <u>September 30</u>, a Saturday designated as GFWC National Day of Service. The goal is to end hunger by volunteering, donating, or organizing a community service program. We have agreed to a \$25 minimum fee, payable by check to LNWC. If you know that you'll be unavailable on this date, our Treasurer will accept checks at any time before Sept. 30. There will be a signup sheet at the June meeting, and RSVPs will be taken throughout the summer by e-mailing me. More details will be discussed at the June meeting on the 8th. Twenty five dollars is the suggested minimum per person, but you're welcome to give generously to this cause.


# Painting Rocks/Pebbles with Uplifting Messages

The Health and Wellness Committee will be kicking off a fundraiser in the Fall after LNWC returns from Summer break.





## **WOMEN OF THE MONTH:**

Our next Women of the Month is someone who has made service a big part of her life. She was really touched by people helping her and her husband during a tragic circumstance in her daughter's life and because of that wants to help others and repay the gift. As she says, "We need to help each other."

Our WOTM grew up in Upstate New York where her family name was honored with a street name after her grand - father who helped survey the City of Utica. Her father worked in manufacturing and her mother was such a fast data processor that they used to stick a clock next to her and video her to prove how fast she could enter data.

Our WOTM was born in Herkimer, New York and has 1 older sister and 1 younger brother. She earned an Associates degree from Mohawk Community College and then earned her BA in Business Administration, with a specialty in Accounting from SUNY- at Brockport. She met her husband on a college ski trip. He scoped her out and decided to meet her at the Chair lift. They ended up sharing a meal at the ski lodge. It would take a little bit of time before they would start dating, but they both ended up developing a friendship at a Catskills summer Camp and would start dating from there on out. They got married in 1988.

During high school she won 3 beauty pageants, including winning a local competition that would send her to Ms. New York State Teenager. She played the clarinet in high school and was also the high school's drum majorette!

She moved to Laguna Niguel in 1990, they have a son who is 30 and married living in Lake Forest and her daughter is 28.

When their daughter was just 4 years old she was diagnosed with Leukemia- she would go through 2.5 years of treatment and is now cured. After receiving a wish from Make a Wish Foundation, her daughter would become a Make a Wish Ambassador.

In 1995 our WOTM started working at the IRS- she Started in Facilities Management for about 8 years, then she worked 17 years as an Internal Revenue Agent where she audited individuals and businesses with assets less than \$10M. Two years ago she had the opportunity to be a Public Affairs Specialist with the IRS and that is what she does now.

Our WOTM loves to serve. She served as her daughter's GS Leader for 12 years. (she was a Girl Scout herself). She



became the GS representative to the LN Parade. She was the service unit manager for Laguna Niguel, she then moved on to Association Chair for Laguna Niguel and Aliso Viejo. For 15 years she was the Day Camp Director/Business Manager for the GS Day camps at LN Regional Park. Between campers and volunteers it was 500 people gathering for a week. She has traveled to both Switzerland, Paris and Italy with the Girl Scouts. She is still involved as the MC for the International Food Fair and is the Gold Award Advisor and in charge of all Fall Product Sales in Laguna Beach. In 2020, she received the highest honor a volunteer can receive in the Girl Scouts organization: the "Thanks" Badge.

She still volunteers for the Taste of Aliso Niguel, even though her kids graduated years ago. She has been a Sunday school teacher as a youth & adult, and she is a hospitality minister at St. Tim's Catholic Church, she serves on the LNWC Board as CoChair of Ways and Means. She is also recipient of the One OC Award in 2020 for her spirit of volunteerism in the community.

Her favorite band is "Boston", Favorite Show "Survivor" or "Amazing Race", Favorite Movie "Little Princess and "A Wonderful Life" And her favorite quote: "You get more with sugar and honey than salt and vinegar."






