LNWC 2023 Fall Fundraiser for Mission Hospital, Laguna Beach Behavioral Health

To support Mental Health in our community, the Health and Wellness Committee is having a Fall fundraiser to support the patients and work of the staff at Mission Hospital in Laguna Beach. This center specializes in psychological and psychiatric treatment for adults. Many of the inpatients arrive with few or no belongings, often having had an acute mental crisis or emotional disturbance. These patients could be our loved ones, our neighbors or anyone in our community. The goal of the center is to stabilize patients and provide diagnosis, behavioral therapy, coping skills, and self-esteem enhancement to support the patients' mental health and wellness in a calm safe and comfortable space.

Our fundraiser will collect donations to support the work of the nurses, psychiatrists, social workers, and case managers and help provide comfort and support the environment for these patients to begin their recovery journey.
